Founded in 1939, the American Society for Public Administration (ASPA) is the largest and most prominent professional association for public administration. With a diverse membership of 8,000 practitioners, scholars and students, ASPA serves as the principal arena for linking theory and practice in the field of public and non-profit administration. It focuses its efforts on five major areas:

- 1. Advancing the art, science, teaching, and practice of public and non-profit administration.
- 2. Promoting the value of joining and elevating the public service profession.
- 3. Building bridges among all who pursue public purposes at home and internationally.
- 4. Providing networking and professional development opportunities to those committed to public service values.
